INTRODUCTION

You will be aware that in recent years we have consulted with the local people of Liberton/Gilmerton in successfully delivering environmental improvements under the Neighbourhood Environment Programme (NEP). This annual programme has given representatives of the community a strong say in allocating spend on 2 elements of Council funding, Housing Revenue Account NEP and Roads Capital NEP work.

Over the last year with agreement through the Liberton/Gilmerton Neighbourhood Partnership in December 2013, we have been working towards building on the success of the NEP's investments by exploring ways where we can maximise opportunities for local decision-making in the process following a participatory budgeting approach. We would therefore like to develop this approach for 2015/16 with your support.

It is our intention to engage as widely as possible with the local community in the selection process of the NEP projects for 2015/16 by using a variety of sources including social media, website and local libraries. We hope to improve and engage further with all existing groups such as registered tenant's organisations, neighbourhood forums and community councils, but we will promote increased participation through widening the window of selection process over a 2 week period (30 March – 13 April) prior to a final selection meeting. Those living in the area will be able to register and vote for projects either online, in person at Council buildings in your area during the voting window or at the actual selection evening on 21 April 2015 at the South Neighbourhood Office and Library.

The proposed format for selection is very similar to a very successful £eith Decides NP programme for community grant fund allocation and we are confident this can be as successful for LG NEP proposals this year and help to involve local people in making decisions in how Councils resources are used.

Further information about how to register and participate will shortly be available on the Liberton Gilmerton NP website.





This will be a joint proposal between both Housing and Regeneration and the Local Roads NEP's



Installing a new bin nest would enhance the area and complement last project of renewing the path and fence.


