



## 3 Population change 2003 to 2013: Edinburgh, Edinburgh city region\* and Scotland





## 4 Difference between people moving into and leaving Scottish cities 2004 to 2013







## 5 Births and deaths in Edinburgh and Scotland per 1,000 population 2004 to 2013





#### 6 Overseas workers registered in Edinburgh 2012 to 2014 (countries of origin)








#### 7 Edinburgh and Scotland male and female age structure 2013





#### 9 Percentage of residents with limiting health issues in major UK cities 2011





#### 10 Residents' wellbeing rating 2014













## 15 Percentage of household waste recycled in Scottish cities 2011 to 2014 (financial years)









## 18 Percentage of Eco schools with green flag award Scottish cities 2014










#### 23 School leaver destinations in Edinburgh 2014



## 25 Highest qualification of working age residents of Edinburgh 2013







## 29 Economic status of residents aged 16 to 64 in Edinburgh and Scotland 2014





#### 31 Employment rate in UK cities 2014







## 35 Annual earnings (median) per resident in major UK cities 2013 and 2014







#### 36 Percentage of working age population claiming Job Seekers Allowance per month 2014




## 37 Percentage of 16 to 24 year olds claiming Job Seekers Allowance per month 2014













## 46 Gross value added (GVA) per capita in major UK cities 2012










## 58 Estimated annual business visitors to Edinburgh by country of residence 2011 to 2013







## 66 Rail passenger numbers (millions) Edinburgh stations 2008 to 2014









#### 69 Superfast broadband coverage in major UK cities 2013












