TOP TEN PRIORITIES

ONE

Improve the condition of Edinburgh's roads, paths and pavements for all. i) We will improve the technical specification of repairs. ii) We will prioritise improvements and iii) commit more money and iv) restructure the tendering and delivery of repairs and maintenance to get the best value for money

TWO

Improve waste collection and street cleaning making them more reliable, more cost effective whilst reducing paid landfill taxes and increasing recycling rates. We will tender parts or all of the service, always prioritising higher standards and lower costs

THREE

Create an Edinburgh Index, published annually or more frequently, showing an assessment of road, path and pavement conditions, recycling rates, cost of council tax collection, cost of household refuse collection along with other key measures of council performance.



FOUR

Speed up the provision of all types of housing, especially on brownfield sites. This will be achieved by measures which include a reduction in planning delays and a removal or reduction of the 25% affordable housing requirement for targeted brownfield sites taking pressure from green space development.

FIVE

Suspend the implementation of the remaining phases of the 20mph zones and undertake a review of the blanket policy.

SIX

Scrap current plans for the extension of Sunday Parking charges in the city centre.

SEVEN

Reject the current business case for extending the trams as too expensive, too long (5-6 years) and too soon (the inquiry by Lord Hardie has still to report).



EIGHT

Reduce congestion on Edinburgh roads through a range of measures including: i) improved roadworks co-ordination ii) prioritise flow (not speed) reducing stop/start impact and iii) improve traffic light responsiveness

NINE

Develop a new cultural trust for museums, art galleries, theatres and libraries bringing on board expertise from the voluntary, culture and business sectors.

TEN

Improve the maintenance of school and other council buildings.



EDUCATION

Edinburgh Conservatives will:

Prioritise improving attainment for all children in schools.

Work with head teachers to **encourage improvements in exercise** and fitness amongst young people through the Daily Mile, StepToday or other measures.

Create a new board of head teachers, university and business leaders and parents to progress the achievement of the right skills for young people.

Offer prizes in conjunction with Head Teachers for pupils and schools which achieve distinction and excellence in specific fields



HOUSING

Edinburgh Conservatives will:

Prioritise delivering different sizes and types of properties and ownership.

Engage with residents, students and universities and colleges to find the best response to the significant expansion of student accommodation provision.

Trial self build serviced housing plots.

Maintain a mix in the City Centre which includes a healthy residential component.

Improve energy efficiency in housing through planning and through council house maintenance.



COUNCIL EFFICIENCY

Edinburgh Conservatives will:

Ensure Council Tax is at the lowest level possible, always prioritising value for money and quality of service for the taxpayer.

Streamline the running of the Council by taking city wide decisions in a Council Executive Cabinet.

Develop further the four service delivery and administrative localities of the city.

Review Council membership of outside bodies reducing membership of such bodies by at least 25% in order to focus on key priorities.

Make it easier to report faults or poor service and to carry out routine transactions with the council.

Reduce the number of committees, streamline the remainder and review and reduce the number of working groups.



TRANSPORT

Edinburgh Conservatives will:

Work with the Scottish Government and transport bodies to find solutions for congestion on the City Bypass.

Increase targeted provision for pedestrians such as safe school zones, pedestrian zones and addressing casualty blackspots.

Support a summit of local and national groups to make better use of rail provision.

Improve the condition of and **extend cycle paths** and routes.

Link up current cycle paths across the city centre.

Retain Lothian Buses in council ownership.



SPORT, LEISURE, CULTURE & HERITAGE

Edinburgh Conservatives will:

Commit to reducing air pollution and continue measures to monitor and reduce particulate pollution.

Commit to the redevelopment of Meadowbank Sports Centre.

Protect and enhance Edinburgh's world class heritage.



SOCIAL CARE & HEALTH

Edinburgh Conservatives will:

Improve the effectiveness of social care by using innovation and technology to support carers.

Encourage, support and extend self directed care.

Prioritise improvement of mental health care.

Review and seek opportunities to support carers of all ages.



BUSINESS

Edinburgh Conservatives will:

Support small businesses by streamlining routine business transactions such as obtaining building warrants, completion certificates and every possible interaction with the Council.
