12-12.45pm	<b>Rolling Hills Chorus</b>	Edinburgh's premier male a capella chorus sing the best of Scottish music old and new.
12.45-1.30pm	<b>Nigel's All Stars</b>	Nigel's All Stars is a traditional Scots Music Group with a range of instruments led by Nigel Gatherer.
1.30-2.15pm	<b>Gilmerton Singers</b>	Gilmerton Singers are a singing group with a variety of songs many of which have three-part harmonies.
2.15-3.00pm	<b>Ceilidh Caleerie</b>	Ceilidh Caleerie grew out of Scots Music Group 'Playing for Dancing class' and play regularly for community charity ceilidhs around Edinburgh.
3-3.45pm	<b>Magnus Turpie</b>	Magnus Turpie plays B/C button accordion, guitar, ukulele, fiddle, snare drum and dabbles in trombone. He is a regular performer at various festivals and clubs.
3.45-4.30pm	<b>Sangstream</b>	Sangstream are a Scots Folk choir singing traditional and modern songs unaccompanied and in harmony.

11.45-12.30pm	<b>Karl MacRae</b>	Karl's specialism is traditional folk music, playing accordion and fiddle in local and national mods as well as Ceilidhs and Burns events.
12.30-1.15pm	<b>Louise Guy</b>	Louise initially studied music with recorder in 1970's. She re-engaged with her musical roots and is now an active musician playing the recorder family of instruments.
1.15-2.00pm	<b>Play It Again Tam</b>	Play It Again Tam are a six-piece band playing distinctive Scottish tunes chosen and arranged by Sarah Northcott.
2-2.45pm	<b>Kleyne Klezmer Trio</b>	Kleyne Klezmer includes clarinet, tuba and accordion. They bring the vibrancy of Yiddish dances to community events throughout the UK.
